If you search for a good place for shopping you will find it in the district called Civic. It's the City Center and also an important business area. For tourists, there are a lot of interesting museums, for example the "Canberra Museum and Gallery", which presents the history of the city. Another museum that is worth being visited is the "National Museum of Australia", which is near the lake. Its special futuristic design attracts plenty of visitors.

However, the city is also very lively and colorful. The big festivals are a good opportunity to get to know Canberra's people and celebrate together. For example, the Stonefest that takes place at the end of October. It's the biggest festival for rock music in Australia. There is also the great folk festival in March before the Canberra Day; it's a huge party that lasts ten days.
